1. **2008 to Present: CAP's Aviation** - contract instructor teaching FAR 135.331 Crewmember Emergency Training and an aviation-oriented version of AHA Heartsaver CPR, AED & First Aid courses. As of Jan 1, 2020, I've taught over 415 FAR 135.331 courses, including traveling to other locations to deliver the course to various customers. Additionally, I've have taught 172 AHA courses to aviators.
2. **2004 to Present: Contractor with Emergency Response International** - teaching dozens of survival courses to Customs and Border Protection Air & Marine pilots, aircrews and marine officers. Also taught several weeklong mountain, desert & tropical survival courses to USCG Aviation Survival Technicians (Rescue Swimmers), Army helicopter pilots and Textron Aviators.
3. **1980 to Present: Lecturing & teaching survival, self-reliance and emergency response** courses to military, government, municipalities, educational institutions, companies, SAR organizations, first responders, non-profit groups, and general-public audiences. Recent clients include NBCUniversal, CERT organizations, SOS Survival Products and disaster professionals. Founded Survival Educators in 2003.
4. **1980 to 2003: President/CEO Tim Kneeland & Associates, Inc.**, a special events adventure management and training company. Created and produced cross-country skiing, canoeing, wilderness, safety and bicycling events, including 22 across America, dozens of 3 to 7-day adventures, and 2 logistically challenging around-the-world cycling tours. The first was called Odyssey 2000 and traveled through 45 countries on six continents with 250 people from Jan 1 to Dec 31, 2000. Odyssey required chartering 14 aircraft, including 747s.

6. **1976 to 1977: Graduate school** - University of Minnesota. 1976 - BA Eastern Washington University.
